**Policy:**

Prior Learning Assessment is a method by which a student may, with appropriate evidence and documentation, be able to obtain credit for learning acquired outside of and prior to admission to the Canadian Institute of Natural Health and Healing College.

At Canadian Institute of Natural Health and Healing, Prior learning Assessment describes below:

Transfer Credit: the awarding of credit towards a diploma or certificate program is usually on a course by course basis, for work done at another post-secondary institution.

General Principles for all categories:

- The combined credit recognized by the above methods may not exceed 30% of the total credit required to complete a Canadian Institute of Natural Health and Healing diploma or certificate program.
- Only course work completed at an accredited or registered post-secondary institution may be considered above.
- Eligibility for Prior Learning Assessment does not constitute entitlement to credit.
- All decisions on Prior Learning Assessment are final.

Canadian Institute of Natural Health and Healing diploma or certificate programs currently will accept:

- Only those credits with a final mark of 80% or higher will be eligible for consideration for Transfer Credit.
- Course hours must meet our minimum of each individual course hours or exceed it will be eligible for consideration for Transfer Credit.

Applicants must submit the following documentation:

- Official transcript(s)
- Course descriptions
- Detailed course outlines (syllabi)

Prerequisite for graduation of the Wholistic Practitioner, Natural Health Practitioner and Esthetician Program:

- A student is required to give a copy of a valid Standard First Aid and CPR certificate granted to them before the Wholistic Practitioner, Natural Health Practitioner and Esthetician Diploma will be granted.

- The valid Standard First Aid and CPR-C certificate must be equivalent to the Saint John's Ambulance Standard First Aid and CPR-C certificate.
- The Standard First Aid and CPR-C certificate course can be taken any time before or during the Practitioner, Natural Health Practitioner and Esthetician Program.
- Canadian Institute of Natural Health and Healing does not offer this course, meaning a student will have to find a company to take the Standard First Aid and CPR-C certificate course from on their own time and money.
